



Introduction

Central Coast Volleyball Club (CCVC) welcomes all players to the first season of the CCVC Social Competition. To make this possible, a lot of hard work has been put in by our Committee; who are all unpaid volunteers that have a passion for furthering the participation of Volleyball on the Central Coast.

Season One of the CCVC Social Competition sees over 80 players participate across 12 teams, with four teams in each of our three grades. The committee hopes that Season One can be the starting block that hopefully sees more players and more teams playing in the Social Competition in future seasons.

The First Round of the Regular Season starts on Sunday March 13 with the Ninth and Final round expected to be played on Sunday May 22. Finals will follow the end of the Regular Season and the format will be announced at a later part in the season and are expected to take place on Sunday May 29.

Each week (**except Week 1**), there will be two 90-minute time slots (5:00-6:30, 6:30-8:00). The 90 minutes is split up as follows:

- The first/last 15 minutes (5:00-5:15/7:45-8:00) is for setup/packup of the nets, courts and scoring tables. The **two teams playing** the match are responsible for doing the setup/packup on their court, as this will ensure that each team has equal responsibility for setup and packup across the season. This also ensures that if the playing teams are not timely with setting/packing up the courts, they will lose out on game time.
- The next 10 minutes (5:15-5:25, 6:30-6:40) is for the 10-minute warm-up:
 - 4 minutes warm-up (passing)
 - 4 minutes spiking lines (half from position 4, half from position 2)
 - 1 minute serving
 - 1 minute to get into rotation and be ready for the first serve.
- The next 60 minutes (5:25-6:25, 6:40-7:40) is match time where a maximum of five sets can be played.
- The final 5 minutes (6:25-6:30, 7:40-7:45) is the “transition time” for the duty team to finish the scoresheet and check all players have signed on

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Why is the Social Competition starting 30 minutes later than usual in Week 1 (March 13)?

We have been advised that the courts will not be available at 5pm, so we have decided to start Week 1 at 5:30pm and finish at 8:30pm.

Where can I find the rules and Covid Policy of the Social Competition?

Are there any opportunities to participate in Training with CCVC?

The club runs training on almost every Thursday during the year and is a fantastic way to help build your skills and confidence in volleyball. Training is held at Niagara Park Stadium and goes for 2 hours for Beginners (5-7pm) and 3 hours for Seniors, Intermediates and Juniors (7-10pm) at a cost of \$10 per player. Training sessions involve drills, skills and games and will help complement the game experience you have on Sundays.

How do I pay for the Social Competition?

The cost for the Social Competition is \$100 per player and must be paid by no later than **Sunday March 13** otherwise players may not be allowed to take the court. It is important that if you may not be able to pay before this date that you contact the club via email at secretary.cvc@gmail.com ASAP to discuss your options. Do I need to be registered with Volleyball NSW (VNSW) to be allowed to participate?

Yes, all players must be registered with VNSW to be eligible to participate in the Social Competition and players confirmed they agreed to this condition when they completed the Social Competition Registration Form. VNSW Registration can be done [here](#) and will cost from \$48 for under 18s and \$59 for Adults, including a \$15 annual fee to be a member of the Central Coast Volleyball Club. The club uses the annual fees to subsidise the purchase of new equipment and the operation of all the club's volleyball programs across the year.

I completed a registration form and stated that I would like to play in one grade and I have been placed in another. Why is that?

The club asked for the player's preferences on the Registration Form regarding which grade they'd like to compete in to help us allocate players to a grade that will best suit their ability and experience. The coaching staff on the CCVC Committee have reviewed the abilities of all players and in some circumstances have made the decision to assign a player to a different grade that is best suited to that player. Player grading will be reviewed before Season Two of the Social Competition based off the observations of the CCVC coaches, who may make recommendations for players to be "regraded" in Season Two.

I asked to be placed in a term with a particular person, but I haven't. Why is that?

The club asked every player in B and C Grade at the first two training sessions whether had any family and/or friends that they would like to play with in a team together. In almost every instance, the club has been able to make this possible however there may be some circumstances where it was not possible. This would be usually because of at least one of the following reasons:

- The player you asked to play with is going to be playing in a different division to you
- We are capping teams at a maximum of eight players to ensure everyone gets a fair amount of time on court
- As the Social Competition Rules only allow for a maximum of 5 male players on the court at any one time, we have tried (where possible) to ensure each team has two female players in their team.

Is it too late to join a team for Season 1 of the Social Competition?

By the time this document has been sent to our members, most teams are full meaning there may only be a very small number of spots left available (mainly in C Grade). Registrations have been open since January 22 which the committee considers to be ample time for players to express their interest. Whilst we will only allow a maximum of 8 players per team, this does not mean that every team will have 8 players. Should you wish to be considered for Season 1, you must contact the club and complete a [Social Competition Registration Form](#) ASAP.



Will I get to play in the same team in Season 2?

The CCVC Committee's plan is to reward those who registered in a timely manner and committed to Season 1 by giving them first option to remain in their team for Season 2. We will send a survey out to all players during the later weeks of the Season that will allow players to confirm that they will play in the Next Season. Whilst we will do our best to keep the teams as similar as we can for Season 2, there a number of factors that will impact whether you will get to play with the same team and/or players including:

- Players deciding not to participate in Season 2
- Players being "regraded" to a different grade by the CCVC Coaches
- An increase in team nominations: CCVC Social Competition will hopefully see team numbers increase in Season 2 which may mean we need to move players around to create new teams or replace players in teams where they have lost players.
- If you do not complete the CCVC Social Competition Season 1 Survey in a timely manner

How do I keep in touch with my teammates to make sure we will have a full team?

Once teams are finalised, we may send an email to each team with the email addresses of their teammates to enable them to work out a suitable method of contact such as WhatsApp or Facebook Messenger. If you are provided with the email addresses of your team, you are ONLY to use those email addresses to email about the Social Competition. Any use of the email addresses of the team for any purpose outside CCVC Volleyball may be deemed as a breach of the Code of Conduct.

When are Finals going to be held?

The CCVC Committee are currently working through what the most suitable format for finals will be. We have been notified by Breakers Stadium that the courts will be unavailable on Sunday the 5th and 12th of June so whilst it is likely all finals will be played on Sunday 29th May, we will advise of the finals format at a later date.

Why are there no matches on the 20th of March or the 17th of April?

On the 19th and 20th of March, the Central Coast is hosting a round of the State Cup and the 17th of April is Easter Sunday. As a result, the CCVC committee have decided not to schedule matches on these Sundays.



How many players does my team need on a Sunday to avoid forfeiting?

As outlined in the Social Competition Rules, a team must have a minimum of 5 players to field a legitimate team; 4 of these players must be registered with this team and 1 of these must be female. Teams can seek a maximum of 1 replacement player from other teams if they have 4 or 5 players as follows:

- For A Grade teams, they can seek replacements from B Grade and C Grade players.
- For B Grade teams, they can seek replacements from B Grade and C Grade players.
- For C Grade teams, they can seek replacements from C Grade players.

If a team needs to forfeit, it is important that the team notifies CCVC via email to comp.cvc@gmail.com ASAP. Note that A grade teams must notify by Friday 11:59pm (NSW Local Time) of a forfeit to avoid further penalties (as outlined in the rules).

How come some teams must do more duties than others?

Because there is an odd number of rounds (nine) in the regular season, some teams will do five duty turns and some will do four. In fact, the person who wrote the draw for the Regular season is in a team that will be doing the most (five) duty turns.
